- iv. Faculty Board representatives have a responsibility to represent the views of their constituency, and are expected to consult appropriate student members of the SSJC in forming such views.
- v. Faculty Board representatives should also note that they must leave a Board meeting when reserved business is discussed. Reserved business consists essentially of those matters referring to academic assessment of students (e.g. examiners reports) and appointment of staff.
- vi. The student members of the Faculty Board have full voting rights for unreserved business.

All candidates are encouraged to send a brief manifesto (preferably typed) to the Teaching Office by Thursday 16 November. These manifestos will be circulated to all students before election day.
